

**ORDINANCE NO. CO-2022-14**

**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS  
PERSONAL PROPERTY OWNED BY THE VILLAGE OF MAYWOOD  
(Maywood Police Department: Electronic Equipment and Motor Vehicles)**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 11-76-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-76-4), the Village President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Maywood (the “Corporate Authorities”) may dispose of personal property owned by the Village of Maywood (“Village”) when, in the opinion of a majority of the Corporate Authorities, such property is no longer necessary, useful to, or for the best interests of the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, the Maywood Police Chief has requested that certain surplus personal property owned by the Village, as described in **Exhibit "A"** attached hereto and made a part hereof, be disposed of pursuant to State law because it is no longer necessary, useful or in the best interests of the Village to retain the surplus personal property; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Maywood, Cook County, Illinois, deem it no longer necessary, useful or in the best interests of the Village to retain the surplus personal property described in **Exhibit "A"** attached hereto and made a part hereof, and desire that the Village Manager dispose of such property in any lawful manner.

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF MAYWOOD, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION 1: Declaration of Surplus Property; Approval of Sale/Disposal.** The Village President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Maywood (the “Corporate Authorities”) find and declare that all itemized property of the Village set forth in **Exhibit "A"**, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, is surplus personal property because it is no longer necessary, useful or in the best interests of the Village to retain such property. The Village Manager, or his designee, is authorized to dispose of the personal surplus property of the Village set forth in **Exhibit "A"** in any lawful manner in “AS-IS, WHERE-IS” condition.

**SECTION 2: Repealer.** All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, to the extent of such conflict, are repealed.

**SECTION 3: Severability.** Each section, paragraph, clause and provision of this Ordinance is separable, and if any provision is held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance, nor any part thereof, other than that part affected by such decision.

**SECTION 4: Ratification.** All actions of the Corporate Authorities, agents and employees of the Village that are in conformity with the purpose and intent of this Ordinance, whether taken before or after the adoption of this Ordinance, are ratified, confirmed and approved.

**SECTION 5: Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption, approval and publication in pamphlet form as required by law.
